





Segerstrom Hall

Capacity: 2,994, opera house style with proscenium

Orchestra - 1,145 to 1,236 depending on the rows in use

Orchestra Terrace - 679

Loge - 478 Balcony - 601

Aesthetics: Napoleon red granite and glass façade, highlighted by soaring Grand Portal arch and Richard Lippold's sculpture Fire Bird.

Patron accommodations: The Center Room (private donor lounge), Plaza Cafe, concessions and first aid station.

Box office: Segerstrom Center's primary box office for all advance ticket sales. It is located at the street level entrance to Segerstrom Hall and open daily 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. or until half an hour after curtain time on performance days.

Technical specifications: Stage performance space – up to 8,075 square feet; 124′ 10″ x 64′ 3″. Height from stage to top of stage house is 110′; orchestra pit accommodating up to 90 musicians; wing space and flies; advanced lighting and sound systems available; loading dock available.

Artist Accommodations: Five private star dressing rooms at stage level, five substage principal dressing rooms accommodating two artists each, five substage chorus dressing rooms accommodating 40-50 persons each, two rehearsal rooms. Wardrobe room with laundry and alteration facilities, scene shop, production offices and artists lounge are also available.



Renée and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall

Capacity: 1,704 in front of performance platform

250 choral seating behind platform available to patrons

when not required for performance

Aesthetics: Beige Portuguese limestone and serpentine glass façade. Multitiered lobby with beige Spanish granite and carpeting, silver leaf ceiling featuring lighting design titled Constellation by Francesca Bettridge which includes Swarovski crystal LED lighting and 300 stainless steel pendants tipped with Baccarat crystal globes. Fixed and loose seats upholstered in scarlet red velvet, individual boxes, three silver leaf acoustical canopies, Canadian maple veneers.

Patron accommodations: Private donor room; Leatherby's Cafe Rouge formal dining with capacity of 110 plus two private salons; The Marketplace Cafe, concessions, first aid station.

Box office: Segerstrom Center's primary box office for all advance ticket sales is located at the street level entrance to Segerstrom Hall and is open daily 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. or until one half an hour after curtain time on performance days. For day-of events, the Concert Hall has is own private box office in the lobby open one hour prior to performances for event ticket purchases and will call.

Technical specifications: Performance platform 65' wide x 48' deep. Adjustable acoustics made possible by use of four reverberation chambers, 128 concrete and wood doors to adjust the volume of the space and reverberation time, three adjustable acoustical canopies above the performance platform and draperies in the hall. There are also fabric banners in the reverberation chambers which can be lowered to absorb sound as needed. Advanced lighting and sound systems and loading dock available.

Pipe organ: Designed by C.B. Fisk. Silver leaf over wood façade, 4,322 pipes, 75 stops, including 57 individual voices, 4 manual keyboards 61 notes each, 1 pedal keyboard 32 notes. Dimensions 40' wide, 48' high, and 12' deep; 30 tons.

Artist accommodations: Three private star dressing rooms. Six private practice rooms; two larger rehearsal spaces (subject to availability), and a performers lounge.



Samueli Theater

Capacity: Maximum capacity including main floor and mezzanine – 300 stadium seating, 320 club/cabaret-style with tables of four, 600 general admission and cocktail reception, variable for banquets, meetings, seminars and other special events.

Aesthetics: Samueli Theater is part of the structure that also includes the Renée and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall, but has its own lobby. Beige Portuguese limestone and glass façade includes a marquee of frosted laminated glass panels. Interior of maple hardwood floors, split block and maple walls.

Patron accommodations: Concessions and first aid station.

Box office: Segerstrom Center's primary box office for all advance ticket sales is located at the street level entrance to Segerstrom Hall and is open daily 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. or until one half an hour after curtain time on performance days. For day-of events, Samueli Theater has is own private box office in the lobby open one hour prior to performances for event ticket purchases and will call.

Technical specifications: Room dimensions – 57' 4" x 81' 4"; floor to grid – 23'; maximum stage size 32' wide x 20' deep; contact venue technical director for lighting and sound specs; loading dock available. Various configurations include thrust stage, club-style, seminars, banquets, special events. Some acoustical adjustment available.

Artist Accommodations: Three dressing rooms accommodating four people each; more rooms subject to availability; six private practice rooms; two larger rehearsal spaces (subject to availability); performers lounge.

Center presentations: Concert Series, Jazz Club Series, Cabaret Series, Off Center Series, Family Series and special events.

Julianne and George Argyros Plaza

Capacity: Variable from 500-2,000. Can be adapted for simple picnic-style seating, large spaces for tents, exhibits, alfresco dining, concerts and performances.

Aesthetics: 46,000 square-foot space situated between Segerstrom Hall and the Renée and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall. Features the Richard Serra sculpture, "Connector." Sandstone benches were quarried in China. Plants include evergreens, roses and a collection of Cycads, prehistoric ferns that dominated the plant scene during the Jurassic Period.

Patron accommodations: Catering or concessions and lobby restrooms are available.

Lawrence and Kristina Dodge Education Center

Studio Performance Space: Located just off the Dress Circle Lobby of the Renée and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall, the space measures 50' 7" x 62' with a ceiling height of 34', accommodates up to 180 persons for seated banquets, 200 for concerts, seminars and performances, and 225 for receptions. It is surrounded by seafoam green acoustical draperies and has a maple floor. ADA access is through the main lobby of the concert hall. Dressing rooms and performers lounge are subject to availability.

Boeing Education Lab: Located on the third floor of the Renée and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall, the space measures 38′ 10″ x 50′ 2″, with a ceiling height of 34′. An intimate space with capacity for up to 130 persons for seminars, presentations, recitals, concerts, receptions and banquets. Salmon-colored acoustical curtains and maple floor. Restrooms are available adjacent to the space.

Patron accommodations: Restrooms and first aid station.
