ABOUT THE SHOW:

This performance will be a concert featuring the music of Sonia De Los Santos and the Okee Dokee Brothers. They will sing and play instruments. You will find information about the band and the instruments in this guide.

"Somos Amigos" means "we are friends" in Spanish. This performance is bilingual and will include songs in English and Spanish.

Lights, Sound, and Video:

The lights will change colors throughout the performance to complement the music. Some of the lights in the theater will remain on during the performance so you are able to move around, enter, and exit as you need.

The music will be played at a lower level for this performance, but if at any time you find the sound to be overwhelming, please feel free to exit the performance. We also have earplugs and noise reducing headphones available for checkout in the lobby.

There will be a large projection screen behind the band, showing images and lyrics throughout the concert.

The performance is about 60 minutes and has no intermission, but you are free to leave and come back at any time.



The band is made up of three members: Sonia De Los Santos and the Okee Dokee Brothers, Joe and Justin.

Joe and Justin met Sonia when they were in New York City to perform a show. They had friends in common and invited Sonia to perform with them on stage. They soon discovered they shared a love of language: Joe and Justin studied Spanish in high school and college, and Sonia has been learning English her whole life. INSTRUMENTS IN THE SHOW:

This is a banjo:

The banjo is an instrument that comes from Africa, and was brought to North America on slave ships. It is similar in design to instruments still found in Africa today. In its simplest form, it is basically a drum with strings stretched across the top with a neck attached. The banjo is most often used in country, folk, Irish, and bluegrass music. It can have four, five, or six strings.

The guitar is a stringed instrument originating in Spain, usually having six strings, a flat sounding board with a round sound hole in the center, and a fretted fingerboard. It is one of the main instruments in Roots and Americana music.

The jarana is a traditional Mexican guitar with 8 strings and the main instrument in the Son Jarocho style from the state of Veracruz in Mexico. Jaranas come in different shapes and sizes. The one Sonia plays is a "jarana tercera".

The harmonica, also known as a French harp or mouth organ, is a free reed wind instrument used worldwide in many musical genres, like American folk music, blues, classical music, jazz, country, and rock.

The kazoo is an American musical instrument that adds a "buzzing" quality to a player's voice when the player vocalizes or hums into it.

SOMOS AMIGOS VOCAB:

Acoustic Instrument- An instrument that sounds rich and musical without amplification.

Adventure Album- A collection of music written about & inspired by an outdoor adventure.

Amigos - Friends!

Bones- A form of percussion, played with the hands. Originally actual bones, now usually made out of wood.

Café con pan- Meaning "coffee with bread," the name of a rhythm from Mexico.

Canoe- A narrow boat with pointed ends. Often made from materials like aluminum, wood, or fiberglass. The people riding in the canoe propel the boat with paddles.

Chorus- The part of a song that is repeated several times and delivers the main message of the song.

Clogging - Using your feet to make the beat for music. A style of dancing.

Echo- A sound that "bounces" from a surface back to the listener.

Folk Music - Traditional music. Used as a means to tell stories.

Gear- The tools, items, and equipment that a person might take on their adventure. Possible gear includes a tent, camera, snacks, and extra clothes.

Golondrina - A swallow bird.

Harmony- Slight variations to the melody, added to make richer sound.

Inspiration- The reason to create art, whether that's writing a song, drawing, painting or building something.

Lyrics- The words to a song.

Melody- The main musical part of a song.

Old-Time Music - Music inspired by the music of the Appalachian mountains.

Paddle- The object used by a canoe's passengers to propel the craft. A pole with a broad, flat fin at one end.

Songwriting- The act of composing lyrics and/or music.

Spoons- A form of percussion; two spoons clacked together.

Verses- The story parts of a song. Typically non-repeating.
